1. Shawomet translate as “ruling clan”, referring to ???Warwick/Salter Grove as an area restricted to royalty.
2. Pomagansett Pond, also known as Posneganset or Arnold Pond, on Warwick Ave, 1-1/4 miles west of Salter Grove.

3. Ponham Cove refers to the Warwick Neck area. Punquiam was a sachem (chief) who allied with the English settlers, and then was betrayed and murdered by them.
4. Conimicut Village ???
5. Wanton translates as “council” and refers to present-day Rock Island, where council meetings were held for the security afforded by the surrounding g waters.
6. ???-covered long house.
7. Hunter drawing bow on deer.
8. Buck eating berries.
9. Woman making basket with baby in cradle board in front of wigwam, a dome-roofed home formed of bent saplings covered by bark.
10. Woman making blanket in front of wigwam.
11. Woman smoking and drying fish in front of wigwam.
12. ??? in canoe on Pawtuxet River.
13. Sachem Anick translates as “royal town”.
